CHAPTER MEETING PRESENTATIONS



During our January Chapter Meeting, David Zwahr gave the membership his insight into genealogical research and how it relates to proving membership. The first steps include review of various ancestor charts going back at least to the time of the American Revolution. He then honed in on an ancestor who had been referenced in an application to the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR).



February saw the members hear Amelia White speak about the Bryan Museum. J.T. Bryan is a sixth generation Texan and Texas Ex student. He began collecting items of interest in Texas and purchased the Gage Hotel built in 1894 located in Marathon. His collection got large enough to house a building and sought out the vacant Orphans Home on 2st Street built in 1902. The Home operated until 1984 when it went into private hands. The Museum opened in 2015 after extensive renovation. It has a room dedicated to the period of the American Revolution and many items of interest leading to the Battle of San Jacinto and beyond. It has an extensive art and firearm collection as well as saddles, etc.
